

Director's Notes

"The Road Not Taken" is one of Frost's most famous, and most misunderstood poems. Probably the most popular of the various interpretations is a lesson about forging your path in life. While that is an important life lesson, Robert Frost actually simply wrote this poem as a joke, poking fun at his friend Edward Thomas, who was often indecisive about which route to take when the two went walking. Regardless of which one you connect more with, all of the interpretations have one thing in common: making a decision.

The red pill or the blue pill? Crunchy or creamy peanut butter? Our days are full of decisions. Some are little and seemingly insignificant. Some are important and potentially life altering. Sometimes we put way too much stress on a simple decision. Sometimes we jump into a big decision without taking enough time to weigh the options. From asking the powers that be to "clear my mind", to speaking finding the peace within, to choosing between the high road or the low road, to knowing that you can always return home regardless of the path you take, to gathering the courage to not be "fearful of the night", to knowing when you need to choose face a tough situation head on, to just singing about two friends in a park (like Robert Frost and Edward Thomas), the music this evening is meant to take you on a journey. With this concert, the Morris Park Singers provide our own commentary on the "art" of making a choice and what our brains go through during that process.

Kirsten Anderson & Miles Kessler - Orange Juice

This is a song about how the decisions we make have a wide array of implications, affecting our daily lives, relationships, and worldview. These lyrics specifically tackle the difficulties of choosing sobriety as a path forward from trauma, and how this choice fundamentally alters the composition of our lives. While there are decisions big and small, sobriety is one that has a ripple effect felt throughout the lives of the person choosing this path and their loved ones. A decision as monumental as this is one that necessitates empathy, support, and understanding, all of which we need more of in our world.

Brandon Reger-Johnson & Colin Sullivan - For Good

For Good reflects on how the paths we choose and the people we meet along the way shape who we become. Similarly to the traveler in The Road Not Taken, Elphaba and Glinda look back on their friendship and acknowledge that all of their choices, both big and small, are forever intertwined. The song shows how relationships and decisions leave lasting marks on us and make us who we are. Even though we might take different directions in our lives, the song serves as a reminder that we are "changed for good" by the people we've met and the experiences that we've lived.



Olivia Curti - Journey to the Past

This song is about a turning point in Anastasia's life, and how choosing to explore her past will lead her to her future. This song means a lot to me, personally, because while music is not my career, I have decided to continue on the path of being a musician in my personal life. In my early 20's, I wasn't involved with any musical extracurricular activities, but I am now back "where I belong," with being a singer as a large part of my identity. I sang "At the Beginning" from Anastasia for my 6th grade 'graduation' concert, so "Journey to the Past" representing my path as a singer is a full-circle moment.

Ethan Hiedenman & Elizabeth Lacy - Can't Go Back

Can't Go Back is a song about living with the choices that you have made, and trying to move forward despite the what-ifs. The singer has chosen a path to walk, but seems unable to enjoy the path she is walking because she is dwelling on roads untaken. At the same time, the singer realizes that by dwelling on these past choices, she is harming the one she is currently with. The two harmonies flow together yet remain apart. Only a few times does the soprano part sing out, walking its own path - at least until the end of the song, where the lines first echo each other and then converge into unison, coming to a resolution musically and emotionally. This is really Frost's point in the end - whatever path we take, we all end up in the same place.

Travis Loch - Three

Three, to me, is the essence of the struggle we all face in balancing loving our whole selves as we are - the good, the bad, and the ugly - and striving to be the best version of ourselves we can possibly be. Can we break out of the paths and patterns that have not and are not serving us? Can we solidify or forge anew the paths that best serve us? In life the answers to these questions aren't always clear. Life is messy. So maybe most importantly, can we love and be compassionate to ourselves while we figure it out?

Joe Scarpellino - Where I Belong

It's an original song about going where you know you need to be. unapologetically, and confidently. Time is of the essence, and if you know where to go, go!


